Empire, MI is located on Lake Michigan in Leelanau County next to Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore in the northwest section of the lower peninsula, about 30 miles west of Traverse City. Leelanau County is known for cherries, wine, golf, sight seeing, shopping, hiking, biking, and beaches. Make sure to bring your America the Beautiful Senior Pass for entry to Sleeping Bear Dunes.

In January, 2017 National Geographic named Sleeping Bear National Lakeshore as one of the top 21 beaches in the world.

After I receive your registration form and check I will forward directions to Indigo Bluffs. Our goal is to have fun, explore the many sights in the area and spend time getting to better know our fellow club members. We will not have scheduled tours as our goal is to allow you to explore the region at your own pace. I will have a guide with several suggested trips and listings of places to visit. Some of you may want to go as a small group or on your own.

After the Rally you can head south to Goshen, IN for the TDC International Rally. The distance is about 250 miles and I can give you several points of interest to stop at along the way to Goshen.

If you play golf, bring your clubs. There is a golf course about 2 miles away and others not far away. Bring your camera as there are lots and lots of great picture taking venues. Binoculars are a must to see all the sights over the water and wildlife. If you like to bike, Sleeping Bear has a very nice bike trail that is not too difficult a ride.

Note: off road activities in Sleeping Bear Dune National Lakeshore is very limited. However, if you have a Jeep or other off road type vehicle Silver Lake State Park near Pentwater, MI has all kinds of dunes that are open to riding. Pentwater would be a good stop when heading south along Lake Michigan.
